## Bembridge and St Helens Guide 2011

## Faster Broadband - vote now

BT is currently about to start rolling out a fibre optic network which will enable super-fast broadband.

It is unlikely that Bembridge & St Helens would be included early in the national rollout.

However BT have set up a competition, where people can vote to get their exchanges upgraded, and the top 5 (as a percentage of lines on the exchange who have voted) will be included in the rollout. Voting closes on 31 December. At the start of November only 6 votes (out of a possible 2911) had been cast for Bembridge.

Fast broadband would be a huge asset to the area, not only directly being a benefit to our businesses, but also making the area a more attractive proposition for people who are looking to move to the area.

Competition was strong, with 6,021 products being entered from 1,350 producers, and only 95 coveted three star awards were made.
